## Service Spotlight:

Our next Service Spotlight focuses on the Adult Education Centre and the variety of courses it offers.

“The Adult Education Centre in Tunbridge Wells dates back to 1902, this impressive building, designed by the eminent architect Henry T Hare and has several unique features. These include a distinctive frontage, complete with decorative stonework. Moving inside, a grand staircase takes centre stage along with a striking mosaic floor. One of the most prominent features is the magnificent stained glass window which comes in to view at the top of the stairs.

This Centre offers a wide range of courses, with specialist areas for Pottery, Art and Silversmithing. What’s more, with its prominent location in the heart of town, it’s not surprising that Tunbridge Wells is one of the most popular centres with students, with over 3,800 enrolments in 2015/16.

The Centre is one of a number across Kent, which together host the extensive Kent Adult Education programme, aimed to meet the varied needs and interests of communities across the County. Kent Adult Education is part of KCC’s Community Learning and Skills organisation, which provides learning opportunities for adults, young people and families throughout Kent in order to meet their aspirations for improved work skills, better personal development, strong families and healthy creative lives.”
