Consultation:

A series of focus group consultations have been held to discuss and consult on the HLF Activity Plan. Feedback from these sessions is helping to shape the wording of the Activity Plan as well as determine interest and support of facilities such as the Print Room and Artist Resource.

The architects (Purcell) and Interpretation Designers (Metaphor) will be presenting the next phase of concept designs in the Art Gallery on **Thursday 15th June 2017**.

The presentations will take place at **2pm** and **6pm**, with time for Q&A with the design team. You are invited to attend one of these sessions. The designs will be available to comment on in the foyer of the Library and Museum building from the 16th June and will also be online.

On **Saturday 17th June** between **10am – 2pm** the Project Team will be sharing the designs in unit CK03, Ely Court (near Mr Simms) in the Royal Victoria Place shopping centre. This will be informal and a chance to chat with the team and give your feedback.

Your Tunbridge Wells:

As part of funding from HLF, the project team have been developing a series of

trial activities to engage new audiences with the C&LH project.

The 'Your Tunbridge Wells' Family Festival took place on Saturday 27th May at the TN2 Community Centre in the Sherwood Estate.

The event was a trial to engage with the community, with partnerships being made with Temple Grove Academy. The day brought the community together to answer questions about the types of activities and programming that might bring them to the Hub in the future.



Next Steps:

The project team will take part in a Mid Stage Review with HLF at the end of June. This is a pass/fail presentation and will determine whether the stage 2 application can be submitted at the end of August. We are on track to submit our stage 2 bid to ACE at the end of July.
