Tunbridge Wells Borough Council and Kent County Council are working together to create a new Cultural & Learning Hub for Tunbridge Wells. This exciting redevelopment brings together in one conserved and modernised set of buildings the Museum & Art Gallery, Library and Adult Education and our extensive services of learning, information and engagement. To realise this project we submitted applications to Heritage Lottery Fund and Arts Council England and the project has now received Phase 1 funding from both of these funding bodies.

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Requirements:

Due to the nature of this volunteering role, shifts will be varied.

We will circulate available shifts two weeks prior to the event via email. We aim to fill these positions within a week of the shifts being sent out. Shifts will be allocated as fairly as possible. These could be doing public consultation or administration and we will ask you for 2-4 hours of your time. Full training and induction will be provided.

- Must be able to travel to Tunbridge Wells for specified events (via public or own transport)
- This role will mostly see volunteers working with the public, so applicants should feel confident in approaching and speaking to a wide range of people
- Enjoy engaging and communicating with people
- Comfortable entering data on to Microsoft Excel spreadsheets (training will be given)
- Professional and smart appearance
- Be reliable, flexible and a good time keeper
- Volunteers must be 18 years of age or over

*Please note: whilst representing the Cultural & Learning Hub team we ask that volunteers refrain from drinking alcohol at events.
